Coming in April—David Owen Hastings!



Lecture: Quilt Labels to Love April 14, 2025

We are looking forward to seeing **David Owen Hastings!** He will be live on Zoom at our in-person meeting at Rancho San Joaquin Middle School. This is a new format for

us, and we will be trying this out for the first time! Please plan to come in person, enjoy what our guild has to offer, then see David as he joins us live-streaming on our big screen!

David is a modern quilter, graphic designer, print and textile artist, and was the 2020 President of the Seattle Modern Quilt Guild. He creates richly layered contemporary artwork and modern minimal quilt and textile designs. For over 20 years, David has exhibited his artwork in galleries and juried shows, and he works exclusively with nonprofit organizations on their branding and fundraising communications. In this live stream Zoom lecture he will show us how to combine computer-printed custom labels with a woven logo label on our quilts to give them a professional finish, and to record important details for posterity (or for the recipient). Quilts are a wonderful art form, and he feels you should sign your work with a distinctive label. It's a great opportunity for you to consistently brand your quilts, especially those you gift to others on holidays or other special occasions.

It's also an opportunity to weave in the story of your quilt, so the story doesn't get lost. Was the quilt made for a special occasion? Was it made from a pattern, based on tradition, or is it a unique design? Who were the makers, and where was it made? Are there special fabrics used that require particular care? Imagine someone seeing your creation in the future: what would you want them to know?

David will walk participants through the steps to create these beautiful labels and will share alternate labeling methods that draw from his graphic design background.

Coming June 9th—Nancy Prince



We are excited to welcome award-winning quilter, **Nancy Prince.** Nancy is an award-winning quilt artist from Orlando, Florida, <u>specializing in thread painting</u>. Her "anyone-can-do-it approach" to thread painting is fun, easy, and a new way for quilters to broaden their quilting experience.

Nancy's quilts have won numerous awards: the most prestigious being the 2014 Best of Show at the International Quilt Festival in Houston, the 2015 Best of World at Mancuso's Quilt World in New England, and the Marie White Masterpiece award

at Road to California. Her quilts have also won 9 Best of Show awards, and 20 Viewer's Choice awards. Nancy is the author of two books: <u>Simple Thread Painting</u> and <u>Thread</u> <u>Painting with Style</u>. She has taped episodes for "Simply Quilts" and "The Quilt Show" with Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims and has appeared in national magazines.

Nancy is addicted to thread painting and her enthusiasm in workshops can be contagious!!! Students comment on her commitment to one-on-one attention and her upbeat attitude. She travels the country teaching and lecturing to anyone who will listen to share the excitement and creativity thread painting brings to her quilting world. She excels in taking the mystique out of thread painting, making it easy for anyone to master.

Coming Attractions—Workshop Updates



There are no workshops in April or May.

<u>On Sunday, June 8, 2025</u>, we are happy to present award-winning quilt artist, **Nancy Prince.** She is known for her unique form of free-motion Machine Embroidery. Nancy will teach us "Thread Painting" by creating her amazing thread painted "Woodlands" design on fabric.

This workshop offers a hands-on introduction to free-motion machine embroidery, a creative way to embellish your quilts. With Nancy's "anyone-can-do-it" approach, participants will learn how to use their sewing machine as a "paintbrush," with the quilt top serving as the "canvas," and thread as the "paint." A printed photograph will be supplied to boost your confidence in creating this project.



This new skill will help you to embellish your quilts and other fabric projects. All skill levels are welcome!

<u>A kit is required</u> for this class which costs \$19. This includes custom-printed background fabric, 3 pieces of stabilizer, instruction booklet and practice products. A 6" machine embroidery hoop is also required. if you need one, you can order it for an additional \$11.50 at the time of sign-ups.

The workshop will be held at Orange Quilt Bee from 10am to 4pm.

The cost is \$40 for the workshop, \$19 for the kit and \$11.50 for the machine embroidery hoop (optional.)

<u>The schedule for entering quilts is out</u>: The online entry form will open on May 1 and close on July 14. **Ellen Reibling** will be at guild or available on the phone if you need help with your entry. You may enter up to 2 quilts in the main display plus a 2025 challenge quilt. If you have a quilt or other project made from a workshop taught by one of our visiting speakers (Zoom or in person) we would love to see it in the show. This will not be a separate display, but we will put a special sign on each of the workshop creations to show what wonderful workshops we have at Flying Geese.

Remember that your quilt does not have to be finished to enter it, but it must be far enough along in construction that you are sure it will be ready for the show. Quilts to be judged will be collected on September 20 and instructions for turning them in will be provided as we get closer to the time. Judging will take place on September 29, and we will need scribes and helpers on that day. Quilts that are not to be judged will be brought to the Murray Center on Oct 10, time and room to be provided as we near the show date.

What is a UFO? You've purchased the pattern and the fabrics to get started but never got around to getting it started. It's that partially completed top that you started at a class but haven't finished. It's a finished top that still needs to be quilted. It could even be that quilt that just needs binding and a label, but it's been sitting around a while waiting for you to make them.

Looking for ways to finish your UFO quilt projects? Look no further, we have the solutions for you. Sign up for the UFO Challenge to run from May 2025 to April 2026 and a <u>\$10 fee at our next Guild Meeting in May</u>. See the attached handout and sign-up sheet. You can sign up from 1 to 5 quilts.

When you sign up, we have a beautiful ribbon for you to pin on to your name tag. You will be rewarded with one of the five pins for each project completed that you have signed up for. The five months for the quilts to be completed are July, September, November, February, and April. You are more than welcome to turn in early! You will earn points for the drawings. The more points you've earned is an opportunity for more chances. For those who have turned in all five quilts on time (or early) have an opportunity for a grand prize at the end.

Looking forward to seeing you all sign up at the General Meeting in May 2025 to participate in this UFO Challenge. If you are not able to attend the May meeting, please mail in your completed form and a \$10 payable to FGQG directly to Kathleen Quinn so we can hold your place and ribbon! You can sign up any time after the May start date.

<u>I am currently seeking an assistant</u> to help check in and measure the quilts at the monthly general meeting during opening and break time. This position is great to get to know the other quilters in the guild!

UFO Challenge—Handout

UFO CHALLENGE 2025-2026

What is a UFO? You've purchased the pattern and the fabrics to get started but never got around to getting it started. It's that partially completed top that you started at a class but haven't finished. It's a finished top that still needs to be quilted. It could even be that quilt that just needs binding and a label, but it's been sitting around a while waiting for you to make them. Must have started prior to December 2024 and a minimum of 200 square inches (Example 20in x 10in.) <u>Whatever the case, let's dust off those older projects and complete some UFOs</u>. You could even win a prize for doing so!

We want this to be fun and doable for everyone so here's how it's going to work. You choose from one to five UFOs you'd like to complete by April 2026. You tell me which month on which quilt will be done. A completed UFO is quilted and binded. We would really like to see labels and hanging sleeves as well, but for this challenge it's not necessary. You sign up below and pay a \$10 entry fee (no matter how many quilts you submit). You will get a ribbon to get started and will earn a special pin for each quilt turned in.

There will be a drawing each month a UFO is due among those who turn for that assigned month. There will be a special drawing for a "Grand Prize" for those who completed all five quilts on time! Additionally, tickets will be awarded for random drawings throughout our challenge period. Tickets are earned as follows:

- 1 Ticket for each UFO turned in (up to 5)
- 5 Tickets for turning in your UFO on time or earlier
- 3 Tickets for turning in your UFO late
- 1 Ticket if UFO has label
- 1 Ticket if UFO has a hanging sleeve
- 5 Tickets if UFO is older than 2008
- 4 Tickets if UFO is older than 2012
- 3 Tickets if UFO is older than 2016
- 2 Tickets if UFO is older than 2020
- 1 Tickets if UFO is older than 2024

Quilt Sizes:

- 1 Ticket Smaller than a Baby Quilt 2,475 sq in or under
- 2 Tickets Baby/Crib/Lap 45" x 55" = 2,475 sq in and higher
- 3 Tickets Afghan/Throw 55" x 65" = 3,575 sq in and higher
- 4 Tickets Twin 70" x 90" sq in = 6,300 and higher
- 5 Tickets Double, Queen, and King 80" x 90" = 7,200 sq in and higher

Dorothy Bullard—2024 Temperature Quilt

After seeing a member's temperature quilt in the FQ 2023 quilt show, I knew I needed to make one of my own. I found a weather station reporting daily temperatures just blocks from my house, and for an entire year I dutifully recorded the highs and lows. I experimented with what block to make for each day, deciding NOT to make triangles. I designed a simple 3.5" block to represent the daily high, with a random diagonal slash to represent the low. With 366 days in 2024, I was able to make a layout of 18x21 blocks, with dividing squares to indicate the start of each month.

Not all of my corners meet perfectly, and my quilting stitch length is not strictly uniform, but I love the results anyway.

Diane Searer – <u>B2V T-shirt Quilt</u>

This was a virtual Show and Tell because Diane had already given the quilt away. Diane says ... "I took a tshirt quilt class a few years ago from Nancy Chocek and learned some good tips.
