

A true believer that most of our 'piecing issues' can also be overcome while creating the quilt, she'll also demonstrate how to work your way through inaccurate seam allowances, persnickety seam intersections, and a

variety of other 'potential piecing hazards' for beautiful results.



Program Updates — Coming Attractions


February 9 – Patty Murphy

Linda & Carl Sullivan — January 11, 2026

On January 11, 2026, we are kicking off the new year with **Linda Sullivan from Colourwerx**. Linda will be teaching precision piecing with her new pattern **STRIPPIN' AND STITCHIN' WITH PAINT BOX**. **Each student will receive a complimentary copy of this pattern on the day of the workshop.**

This is a fun and easy project using strip piecing and triangles. Linda's tips and tricks allow students a stress-free project to perfect their ¼" seams and tricky triangle shapes.



Additionally, pulling together the supplies for this workshop couldn't be easier: just one 2½" strip roll plus two 1-yard cuts of coordinating fabric is all that is needed for this 48 x 48 quilt.

This workshop will be held at Orange Quilt Bee and costs \$40.

Patty Murphy — February 9

In February, explore color and design through **Patty Murphy's striking Misunderstood Quilt** — a captivating composition made entirely of Flying Geese blocks. How apropos for the Flying Geese Quilt Guild! Using just two colors, this quilt creates a stunning sense of movement and depth, perfect for those who love experimenting with contrast and simplicity. Patty will guide participants through the principles of hue, value, and color placement while sharing tips for developing confident, vibrant color schemes. Students can follow the pattern or adapt the design to suit their own creative vision. Drawing from her book, *Zero Waste Quilting*, Patty will also show how to put every scrap to good use, turning leftover pieces from this project into new creations. Participants will leave with a completed—or well on the way to completed—quilt top and fresh ideas for thoughtful, waste-free quilting.



Patty's book, ***Zero Waste Quilting* is required for the class.** The pattern is included in the book. It is available at Patty's website or on Amazon.

An 18" pillow form works great. You can also choose to make an entire "Spring Hare" quilt with a green background.





UFO Challenge

UFO Challenge — Updates

We now have 26 members participating in the UFO challenge!

What is a UFO? UFO stands for UnFinished Objects. This means that you have purchased the pattern and the fabrics to get started but never got around to getting it started. It's that partially completed top that you started at a class but haven't finished. It's a finished top that still needs to be quilted. It could even be that quilt that just needs binding and a label, but it's been sitting around a while waiting for you to finish it.

It is still not too late to sign up and get those UFOs out of your closets, drawers, boxes, or wherever you are hiding them, then cross them off of your to-dos!

Better late than never, right?

UFO Challenge — Sign Up

UFO CHALLENGE 2025-2026

What is a UFO? You've purchased the pattern and the fabrics to get started but never got around to getting it started. It's that partially completed top that you started at a class but haven't finished. It's a finished top that still needs to be quilted. It could even be that quilt that just needs binding and a label, but it's been sitting around a while waiting for you to make it. Must have been started prior to December 2024 and a minimum of 200 square inches (Example 20in x 10in.) Whatever the case, let's dust off those older projects and complete some UFOs. You could even win a prize for doing so!

We want this to be fun and doable for everyone so here's how it's going to work. You choose from one to five UFOs you'd like to complete by April 2026. You tell me which month on which quilt will be done. A completed UFO is quilted and bound. We would really like to see labels and hanging sleeves as well, but for this challenge it's not necessary. You sign up below and pay a \$10 entry fee (no matter how many quilts you submit). You will get a ribbon to get started and will earn a special pin for each quilt turned in.

There will be a drawing each month a UFO is due among those who turn for that assigned month. There will be a special drawing for a Grand Prize for those who completed all five quilts on time! Additionally, tickets will be awarded for random drawings throughout our challenge period. Tickets are earned as follows:

- 1 Ticket for each UFO turned in (up to 5)
- 5 Tickets for turning in your UFO on time or earlier
- 3 Tickets for turning in your UFO late
- 1 Ticket if UFO has label
- 1 Ticket if UFO has a hanging sleeve

- 5 Tickets if UFO is older than 2008
- 4 Tickets if UFO is older than 2012
- 3 Tickets if UFO is older than 2016
- 2 Tickets if UFO is older than 2020
- 1 Tickets if UFO is older than 2024

Quilt Sizes:

- 1 Ticket – Smaller than a Baby Quilt – 2,475 sq in or under
- 2 Tickets – Baby/Crib/Lap – 45 x 55 = 2,475 sq in and higher
- 3 Tickets – Afghan/Throw – 55 x 65 = 3,575 sq in and higher
- 4 Tickets – Twin – 70 x 90 sq in = 6,300 and higher
- 5 Tickets – Double, Queen, and King – 80 x 90 = 7,200 sq in and higher




