# Program Feature – Next Meeting




## David Taylor — October 13








## October 12—Pictorial Hand Applique

With David Taylor

In October, **David Taylor** will be here to offer a relaxing workshop on “Pictorial Hand Applique.” This workshop will be held on Sunday, October 12<sup>th</sup>.

David’s project is this realistic “Hummingbird” block. He will demonstrate his layered, hand-applique technique with simple shapes using freezer-paper templates and liquid starch. He will cover how he builds his pictorial wall quilts and how to get beautiful details by letting the fabric choices do all the work.

The class will be held at Orange Quilt Bee from 10am to 4pm.



This “Pineapple” project is perfect for using up your scrap stash. With minimal prep, it is ideal for quilters of all skill levels. By the end of the workshop, you’ll have the skills to make stunning “Pineapple” blocks that can be arranged to make a small wall hanging, cozy lap quilt, or your next masterpiece!

## Linda & Carl Sullivan — January 11, 2026


On January 11, 2026, we are kicking off the new year with **Linda and Carl Sullivan** from **Colourwerks**. Linda will be teaching precision piecing with her new pattern STRIPPIN' AND STITCHIN' WITH PAINT BOX.

This is a fun and easy project using strip piecing and triangles. Linda's tips and tricks allow students a stress-free project to perfect their 1/4" seams and cut triangle shapes.

Additionally, pulling together the supplies for this workshop couldn't be easier: just one 2 1/2" strip roll plus two 1-yard cuts of coordinating fabric is all that is needed for this 48" x 48" quilt.

This workshop will be held at Orange Quilt Bee and costs \$40.

#### Submission Time & Location

- Your quilts and/or Creative Arts items will be submitted on-Friday, October-10th-from 12:30-PM-to-3:00-PM.

- All quilts and flat quilted Creative Arts items must have a 4" sleeve. The table runners must have a 4" sleeve on the short end for hanging.

#### Check-In & Pick-Up Process

- ✓ When your quilt or Creative Art is submitted, it will be labeled and placed in a clear plastic bag.
- ✓ You will receive a claim check(s) that you must use to pick up your quilt or Creative Art on Saturday, October 11<sup>th</sup> from 5:00 – 6:00 PM at the Murray Center (after the quilt show).
- ✓ If you will not be able to drop your quilt off, you may have a friend drop off your quilt and get the claim check.





# UFO Challenge

## UFO Challenge Updates

What is a UFO? UFO stands for **Unfinish Objects**. This means that you have purchased the pattern and the fabrics to get started but never got around to getting it started. It's that partially completed top that you started at a class but haven't finished. It's a finished top that still needs to be quilted. It could even be that quilt that just needs binding and a label, but it's been sitting around a while waiting for you to make them.

We currently have 26 members participating in the UFO challenge!

### August/September UFO Challenge Status Report

Here are the status reports for August/September for those UFO challenge completed projects that have been checked in and participated in the Show & Tell and/or will be shown in the Quilt Show:

- We have received 19 quilts with a total of 59,754.75 square inches completed and 202 tickets earned.
- The winners were **Dorothy Bullard** (Black & White Geometric Fabric Layer Cake), **Susan Culhane** (\$15 Gift Certificate from Quilt Passions), and **Kathleen Quinn** (Hot ruler).

All the tickets earned will stay in the raffle jar throughout until the final prizes are drawn in April 2026. If you win a prize that winning ticket will not go back in the jar.



It is still not too late to sign up and get those UFOs out of your closets, drawers, boxes, or wherever you are hiding those projects and getting these done so you can cross off your list of to dos! **Better late than never, right?**

# UFO Challenge—Sign Up

## UFO CHALLENGE 2025-2026

---

**What is a UFO?** You've purchased the pattern and the fabrics to get started but never got around to getting it started. It's that partially completed top that you started at a class but haven't finished. It's a finished top that still needs to be quilted. It could even be that quilt that just needs binding and a label, but it's been sitting around a while waiting for you to make them. Must have been started prior to December 2024 and a minimum of 200 square inches (Example 20in x 10in.) Whatever the case, let's dust off those older projects and complete some UFOs. You could even win a prize for doing so!

We want this to be fun and doable for everyone so here's how it's going to work. You choose from one to five UFOs you'd like to complete by April 2026. You tell me which month on which quilt will be done. A completed UFO is quilted and bound. We would really like to see labels and hanging sleeves as well, but for this challenge it's not necessary. You sign up below and pay a \$10 entry fee (no matter how many quilts you submit). You will get a ribbon to get started and will earn a special pin for each quilt turned in.

There will be a drawing each month a UFO is due among those who turn for that assigned month. There will be a special drawing for a "Grand Prize" for those who completed all five quilts on time! Additionally, tickets will be awarded for random drawings throughout our challenge period. Tickets are earned as follows:

- 1 Ticket for each UFO turned in (up to 5)
- 5 Tickets for turning in your UFO on time or earlier
- 3 Tickets for turning in your UFO late
- 1 Ticket if UFO has label
- 1 Ticket if UFO has a hanging sleeve

- 5 Tickets if UFO is older than 2008
- 4 Tickets if UFO is older than 2012
- 3 Tickets if UFO is older than 2016
- 2 Tickets if UFO is older than 2020
- 1 Tickets if UFO is older than 2024

### Quilt Sizes:

- 1 Ticket – Smaller than a Baby Quilt – 2,475 sq in or under
- 2 Tickets – Baby/Crib/Lap – 45" x 55" = 2,475 sq in and higher
- 3 Tickets – Afghan/Throw – 55" x 65" = 3,575 sq in and higher
- 4 Tickets – Twin – 70" x 90" sq in = 6,300 and higher
- 5 Tickets – Double, Queen, and King – 80" x 90" = 7,200 sq in and higher


